$$23 + 46 = 69 \text{ oranges}$$

Harper made 51 sandwiches for a picnic. She made 24 more sandwiches. How many sandwiches did she make altogether?

$$51 + 24 = 75 \text{ sandwiches}$$

Evelyn bought 34 ice creams for a school event. Her friend bought 25 more ice creams. How many ice creams are there?

$$34 + 25 = 59 \text{ ice creams}$$

James has 63 chocolates. He gets 18 more chocolates from his uncle. How many chocolates does James have now?

$$63 + 18 = 81 \text{ chocolates}$$
